
MIDDLE EAST CAPTIVATING & INSPIRING



Arrive in Arusha where you will be transferred to your luxury hotel with the remainder of the day at leisure. Discover the place where the heavens meet the earth, where the rhythm of nature pounds to the beat of an African drum, and where life is all about a revival of the senses.

DAY 2 • Meal: BLD**Lake Manyara**

Lake Manyara Serena Lodge/

Drive to Lake Manyara this morning, famous for the tree climbing lions and the vast elephant herds. The shores of the lake attract more than 400 species of birds, including the pink flamingos.

DAYS 3 – 4 • Meals: BLD**Ngorongoro Crater**

Ngorongoro Serena / **The Manor Ngorongoro**

This morning drive to Ngorongoro where we will visit Olduvai Gorge enroute, an ancient hominid archaeological site, located in the Great Rift Valley. The excavations by Louis and Mary Leakey in the mid-1950's were important because they established the African origin of humankind. Ngorongoro Crater, one of Africa's most fascinating wildlife spectacles, is a 12 mile diameter caldera and harbors many species of animals including the elusive black rhino. Enjoy lunch in the crater floor during the game viewing drive.


DAYS 5 – 7 • Meals: BLD**Serengeti**

Mbuzi Mawe Serena Camp / **Migration Luxury Camp**

Depart for the Serengeti which is another one of the great game reserves and the jewel of Tanzania. Enroute visit a Maasai Village (Manyatta) for some unique cultural experience. The name Serengeti is derived from the Maasai word for "endless plains" and this is where millions of animals move in the ancient rhythms of the seasons. Your game drives provide views of zebra, giraffe, Thomson's and Grant's gazelle, eland and klipspringer.

DAY 8**Arusha & Depart Home**

Return to Arusha to board your flight back home or on to your next destination.





UGANDA – *An Unforgettable Encounter with Gorillas*



Best Time to Visit:

MAY, SEP – NOV



The Republic of Uganda is a landlocked country in East Africa, bordered by Kenya, South Sudan, Tanzania, Rwanda, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. Although lacking a sea or ocean coastline, the over 90,000 square miles of Uganda lies almost completely within the Nile basin and holds a substantial portion of the expansive Lake Victoria within its border, as well as several other large lakes.

The climate is varied as is the geography, consisting of volcanic hills, mountains, and lakes, with an average elevation of 2900 feet above sea level. Uganda is home to a vast number of species, including a population of the endangered mountain gorillas in the Bwindi Impenetrable National Park, an UNESCO World Heritage Site. In addition to Bwindi, there are nine other national parks and a total of 60 protected areas.

Uganda has plenty to offer as a single destination or Lakani can include it with Kenya and/or Tanzania. It is one of only three countries with access to the rare mountain gorillas. Fly to the international airport of Entebbe and connect to a local flight to Kihikihi airstrip where you will be met and transferred to your accommodations. The gorilla tracking permits are issued in advance and are limited as only eight visitors are allowed to view a gorilla family per day. There will be a briefing before you set out on your guided mountain trek. The adult male gorillas are called Silverbacks because of the silver hair on their backs. It is a truly exhilarating experience to spend an hour with these endearing primates – who share about 98% of our DNA.

Spend two or three nights at Bwindi and then return to Entebbe for your onward destination – or stay longer in Uganda and visit Queen Elizabeth National Park, where you can usually spot the unique Tree Climbing lions and perhaps even the rare Ugandan kob. Continue to Kibale National Park known for its 13 species of primates, as well as leopard, African golden cat, serval, and elephants who travel the wildlife corridor between Kibale Forest and Queen Elizabeth NP. Track chimpanzees, take a birding hike or visit local villages on a cultural trail. For a different experience travel north to Murchison Falls National Park, Uganda's largest national park, where you encounter hippos, lions, and the endangered Rothschild's giraffes.

Uganda Highlights include:

- Two days of mountain gorilla tracking with experienced naturalist guide
- Visit to indigenous Batwa village and learn about their traditional lifestyle
- See golden monkeys of Bwindi
- Spot Tree Climbing lions in Queen Elizabeth National Park
- Track chimpanzees in Kibale Forest National Park
- Take a safari in Murchison Falls National Park to view hippos, elephants, giraffes, and lions



Officially known as the Republic of Rwanda, the landlocked country in the Great Rift Valley of Central Africa bordered by Uganda, Tanzania, Burundi, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo is often referred to as the “land of a thousand hills.” Dominated by mountains in the central and western part of the country, the highest peaks are found in the Virunga chain. With most of the country at a high elevation, the lowest being over 3,000 feet above sea level, the climate tends to be temperate to subtropical with two rainy and two dry seasons each year.

The area has been inhabited since hunter-gatherers settled there in the Stone Age, followed later by Bantu peoples. By the 15th century, clans had transformed into kingdoms and the Kingdom of Rwanda was established. As European colonization expanded in Africa, Rwanda became part of German East Africa in 1897 until it was taken over by Belgium in 1916. The country underwent several periods of civil unrest and atrocities in subsequent years until 1994 when the current system of government, a unitary presidential system with a bicameral parliament was put in place. Rwanda’s economy is largely based on subsistence agriculture to feed their own people. Coffee and Tea are the major cash crops for export, along with the mining industry which is an important contributor. Tourism has been the fastest-growing economic resource in the past two decades.

Rwanda is only one of three countries where one can safely enjoy the amazing mountain gorilla experience. Volcanoes National Park is home to an estimated one-third of the world’s population of mountain gorillas, which have been on the endangered list since 2018. The park is in the northwestern part of the country, and it includes five of the eight volcanoes of the Virunga Mountains. Lakani arranges for you to be met at the airport in the capital city of Kigali. After an overnight, take in the scenic beauty of the landscape on a three-hour drive to Parc National des Volcans where you are accommodated in an outstanding lodge perfectly situated in the foothills of the mountains.

You have two opportunities to encounter a gorilla family, expertly led by a guide who is completely familiar with the habituated families and their usual habits. It may take a couple of hours or perhaps more to reach the adorable creatures. Then you have an hour to spend with them to gaze, take pictures, and just become at one with nature before returning to the lodge. There are other primates to visit while in this rainforest. Your guide will take you to see the golden monkeys. And you may also visit a local community and learn about their socioeconomic and conservation projects. Your experience in Rwanda promises to be life-changing and unforgettable.


The Republic of Ghana is a country in West Africa whose southern border is located on the Gulf of Guinea and the Atlantic Ocean. With an area of almost 100,000 square miles, the landscape varies from coastal savannahs to tropical rain forests and supports diverse wildlife, impressive waterfalls, caves, mountains, rivers, and lakes. The country is rich in history and tradition; its many castles and forts are listed collectively as UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

With Lakani, take an unforgettable expedition-like journey across Ghana, visiting historic and beautiful castles, and colorful local markets; exploring natural wonders; and becoming immersed in the rhythms, rituals, dances, and Royal ceremonies that define the traditions of this extraordinary land.

Begin in the capital city of Accra, deemed one of the world's greatest places to explore in 2023 by Time Magazine. Drive along the coast to Elmina Castle, the oldest European building in Africa, built by the Portuguese in the 15th century. Travel inland to the Kakum National Park, home to the longest and highest rope bridge in the world. Visit Cape Coast Castle, built by the Swedish in 1653. Journey to Kumasi, the spiritual capital of the old Ashanti Kingdom, once one of the most powerful nations in Africa, and home to the special Akwasidae Festival. Then continue to Akosombo on the edge of the Volta River, where the crafting of glass beads and a special ceremony await.

- Explore two of Ghana's most famous and historic castles – Elmina and Cape Coast – UNESCO World Heritage Sites

- Learn about the Voodoo religion at a captivating ceremony – it will surprise many to find out the richness and complexity of this tradition



Officially known as the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia, the landlocked country is in the Horn of Africa. Found north of Kenya, the capital and largest city, Addis Ababa is just west of the East African Rift that began developing about 25 million years ago. There is evidence that some of the earliest human ancestors, hominids, occupied this region over four million years ago. Most notably, the discovery of "Lucy" was found in the Awash Valley in Ethiopia. Some of the oldest Homosapien fossils have also been discovered in the Omo region, dating to about 200,000 years ago.

Often considered the birthplace of coffee, cultivation of coffee beans began in the 9th century and Ethiopia produces the most coffee of any other nation in Africa. It provides income for about 15 million Ethiopians. Other exports include gold, leather, and more recently, flowers and plants.

There are nine UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Ethiopia, making it a well sought-out destination. The rich history of the country from antiquity through to recent times has seen empires, kingdoms, and dynasties leave their cultural, architectural, and religious mark throughout the country. Lakani World Tours can create an itinerary suited to your interests.

Arrive in the capital city of Addis Ababa and tour its National Museum and Trinity Cathedral. Fly to Axum, home to 1700-year-old monuments called steles. Located in the Tigray region, Axum was the center of the Aksumite Empire, that ruled the region from about 400 BCE until the 10th century. Visit the Northern Stelae Park as well as fine archaeological and ethnographic museums. Travel to Lalibela, one of the most important religious sites in the Christian world. Explore the Rock-Hewn Churches constructed during the 12th and 13th centuries. There are 11 unique churches, with many of them connected by tunnels and trenches. They were designed to represent the city of Jerusalem for Ethiopian Orthodox Christians and the pilgrimage site continues to be used for daily worship, as well as a home to clergy and a gathering place for festivals and religious groups and leaders. Take a flight to Gondar, where you see the Royal Enclosure, the remains of a fortress surrounded by a 3,000-foot-long wall. From there you may drive to Bahir Dar, stopping at Amhara villages along the way, to view famous monasteries and the Blue Nile Falls. Then return to Addis Ababa for your homeward bound flight.

It boasts a 620-mile Indian Ocean coastline that is dotted with beaches, offshore marine parks, and coral islands. Mozambique is an excellent location for diving, snorkeling, and numerous other watersports. The delightfully well-preserved Portuguese colonial architecture adds a historic and cultural lure, and the consistently tropical climate make this an inviting paradise.

Mozambique is for those who love the tropics – whether you wish to hike, enjoy water sports, or just relax. It can be a destination itself, or a relaxing add-on to a Southern or East African journey. The most recommended sites are: Maputo – the thriving capital located in the far south. It is known for its diverse architecture and vibrant nightlife. Maputo (Fortress of Maputo), built by the Portuguese in the 18th century. Across the bay, Inhaca Island offers beaches and diving reefs. Some other local sights the Cathedral of Our Lady of Immaculate Conception, the Casa de Ferro and Museum of Natural History.

Island of Mozambique – a UNESCO World Heritage Site off Mozambique's north coast and connected to the mainland by a bridge. The Portuguese colonial structures in Stone Town include the Chapel of Nossa Senhora de Baluarte. The 16th-century Fort of São Sebastião and Palace of São Paulo (a former governor's home) a tribute to when this was the capital of Portuguese East Africa.

Bazaruto Archipelago – six unspoiled and undeveloped tropical islands, and home to Bazaruto National Park, the largest sea park on the African coast. The offshore reefs are pristine, with a plethora of marine life and amazing coral gardens. You can snorkel or scuba dive, saltwater fly-fish or big game fish or watch the dolphins and seasonal migrating humpback whales.

Quirimbas Archipelago – in the north, a 155-mile stretch of 32 coral isles with spectacular reefs and marine life. Many islands are part of its Quirimbas National Park, known for coral reefs, dolphins, whales and endangered dugongs (sea cows). Mangrove-covered Ibo Island has colonial-era ruins surviving from a period of Portuguese rule. Privately owned Medjumbe Island is meant for honeymooners.

Benguerra Island – the second largest with white-sand beaches, lakes and diving sites as well as luxury resorts.

Gorongosa National Park – inland and set in the center of the country. It offers forests, wetlands, and savannahs that shelter wildlife including lions, hippos, and zebras.

Niassa National Reserve – near Tanzania. The largest protected area in the country, and home to elephants and wildebeest





Zambia is a landlocked country situated on a high plateau in southern Africa. Taking its name from the Zambezi River, it is a land of rugged terrain and diverse wildlife, as well as many parks and safari areas. But Zambia's most popular and well-known asset is spectacular Victoria Falls - one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. The largest waterfall in the world, it is indigenously called Mosi-oa-Tunya, or "Smoke That Thunders" – plunging over a mile-wide 320-foot-high cliff at speeds more than 100 miles per hour. It is truly a must-see.

Zambia is also home to a myriad of other waterfalls and National Parks hosting Africa's plains wildlife. The most famous are South Luangwa National Park, located in eastern Zambia at the tail end of Africa's Great Rift Valley, and Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site where you can take a nature walk to see elephant, giraffe, zebra and more. 
IN THE NORTH:

Mauritius National Botanical Garden – a vast 300-year-old botanical garden home to more than 650 varieties of indigenous tropical plants. Highlights are the famous Baobabs, the ineluctable giant water lilies, 85 different varieties of palms, a big spice garden and more.

MADAGASCAR – *Lemurs, rainforest, hiking and diving – a dream destination*

A massive island nation off the southeast coast of Africa, Madagascar is home to thousands of animal species found nowhere else – lemurs being the most famous, and most appealing. Often called the “eighth continent” by ecologists, this unique island also offers beaches, deserts, and forests – rainforests and spiny forests with ancient Baobab trees. The climate is generally tropical yet temperate; with November to April being more hot and rainy, and May to October being cooler and drier.

Madagascar is for adventurous nature-lovers who appreciate unique flora and fauna, as well as unusual rock formations and exotic reserves. The capital of Antananarivo (“Tana”) has the only international airport; stop-overs here are often required when traveling between different sections of the country.

Madagascar can be a destination itself, or an addition to any African journey. Lakani World Tours can create a travel itinerary best suited for you – depending on your time, interests, and budget. Here are the main locations we recommend:

Antananarivo - the capital, located in the middle of the island with expansive and enchanting markets.

Analamazaotra Reserve - “Perinet”, is on the east coast. It is famous as the home of the babakoto “indri” lemur - the largest living lemurs known for their unique haunting call. The forest also shelters sifaka, grey bamboo lemurs, brown lemurs, and the Madagascar tree boa.

Berenty Reserve – on the southeastern tip of the island with three different ecosystems: the southern “spiny thicket” forest, the wet rainforest, and a transitional forest in-between. Each host different lemurs (maki, sifaka, *Microcebus* and even aye-aye). Other unique sites include baobab trees, rare three-cornered palms and funerary art of the Antandroy ethnic group

Diego-Suarez – a port on the northern tip of the island featuring an eclectic mix of architectural styles reflecting its myriad of influences. It is a gateway to the lush national park of Montagne d’Ambre and Ankarana, noted for stunning limestone pinnacles known as the “Tsingy.” Explore bat caves and intimately mingle with crown lemurs.

Masoala – on the northeast coast and the largest National Park of the island. Mammal species here include red-ruffed lemur, red-fronted brown lemur, greater hedgehog tenrec, fosa, brightly colored *Mantella* frogs and whales which visit Antongil Bay. Birdlife includes the endangered Madagascar red owl and Madagascar serpent eagle. Explore the coral reefs teeming with life and beautiful deserted sandy beaches. You may also want to visit Nosy Mangabe in the Bay of Antongil. Here you see the brown lemur, black and white ruffed lemur, the unique leaf-tailed gecko and more. You can enjoy gentle walks or challenging uphill climbs.



Other soft adventure activities include rock climbing, zip-lining, and trekking. The Seychelles is for honeymooners and lovers of water activities. The Seychelles can be a destination itself, or a relaxing add-on stop to an African or Indian journey. Lakani World Tours can create a travel itinerary best suited for you – depending on your time, interests, and budget. The choice of Seychelles island depends on your interests as well as budget. Here is a brief description of what you can find on the main islands.

The Seychelles is an archipelago of 115 islands set in the Indian Ocean 900 miles east of Kenya. The beauty of its beaches is known worldwide - idyllic ribbons of soft white sand lapped by turquoise waters and fringing jungle-covered hills and huge rocky cliffs. The ocean waters are over-flowing with tropical fish and turtles – perfect for diving, snorkeling sea kayaking, swimming, and more.

There are three main islands (the Inner Islands):

Mahé – crowned by towering 3000-foot granite peaks, Mahé offers a treasure trove of flora. It is famous for its beaches, especially Anse Royal which is great for snorkeling. Walk along a palm-fringed path that meanders above the rocky coast. You can also explore lush forest, tea plantations and savor some wonderful native Creole cuisine.

Praslin – the second largest island with soft white sand and crystal-clear waters. Its Anse Lazio beach is considered one of the best in the world. Legendary Vallee de Mai, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is home to a prehistoric rainforest of huge Coco de Mer trees and the rare Seychelles Black Parrot.

La Digue – Only 3 miles long this small island offers calm, shallow water and beaches accessible only by foot. La Digue's diverse wildlife can be seen in its Veuve Nature Reserve. La Digue can also be a day-trip from Praslin, taking the short ferry or helicopter ride.

The Outer Islands are smaller, more exclusive and more remote, most with boutique or castaway retreats. These include North Island - powder-white sands and wild turtle filled turquoise waters of the Ile Du Nord eco-reserve.

Félicité island – dramatically beautiful with massive granite boulders fringing the shoreline and perfect beaches. **Fregate Island** – a private playground with great diving, birding, and beaches. **Cousin Island** – a beautiful nature reserve and pristine ecosystem that hosts some of Seychelles rarest birds. Curieuse Island National Marine Park – a unique island eco-system accessed on twisting walking trails through the mangrove swamps, dotted with giant crabs and a breeding population of Giant Tortoises.

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, Lakani World Tours reserves the right, without notice, to withdraw any or all parts of a tour and or to make such changes as may be necessary. The extra cost, if any, for such changes will be the responsibility of the traveler. In regard to credit card payments for travel services to Lakani World Tours, the traveler (and or cardholder or cardholder's authorized representative) will hold Lakani World Tours and its employees, independent contractors or representatives harmless for any or all charge-backs exercised by them or their credit card companies, originating from any complaints regarding travel services or involving refund requests of monies paid when insurance was not purchased, or for any reason whereby the traveler did not utilize any portion of the prepaid travel services, or any other reasons whatsoever.
