This increasingly popular destination is the fifth largest continent and least populated. Surrounded by the Southern Ocean, it is home to the geographic South Pole and is mostly covered by the Antarctic Ice Sheet that is an average of 1.2 miles thick. Antarctica is governed by 30 countries, in accordance with the 1959 Antarctic Treaty System. Tourism, fishing, and research are the main activities in and around Antarctica. On a visit to seventh continent, you can expect to see various species of penguins, seals, and seabirds like albatrosses. Ten cetaceans may be found in the Southern Ocean surrounding Antarctica, including whales and orcas.

Most travelers visit Antarctica by sea, but it is also possible to participate in a land adventure. Camping, hiking, cross-country skiing, and mountaineering are all possible activities along with a visit to the South Pole. For those who have an adventurous spirit but rather like creature comforts, there is a luxury camp where meals are created by an award-winning chef, accompanied by fine wines, and where you sleep in a fully furnished and heated sleeping pod. During the day, you can experience kite-skiing, explore ice caves, and immerse yourself in a colony of Emperor penguins. The other way to see Antarctica is on an overflight.
